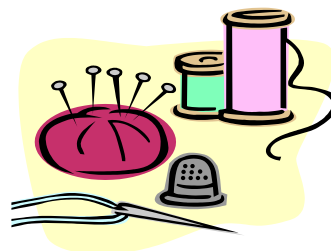

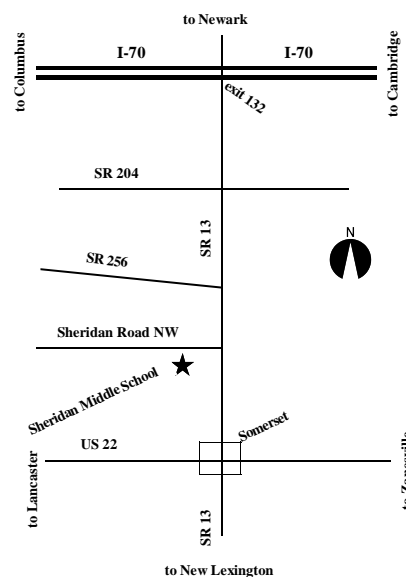

Classes & Descriptions

Beginning English Smocking – OFFERED ONCE - 2:15 p.m. (Eunice Hayes, Sewing Professional, Licking County) Learn basic smocking stitches and how to complete a bonnet suitable for an 18-inch doll. **Kit Cost: \$5.00** which includes a pre-pleated bonnet, embroidery floss, ribbon and needle. **Class Limit: 15**

Beginning Needle Tatting – (DOUBLE SESSIONS) – 10:15 a.m. – 12:05 p.m. & 1:15 p.m. – 3:05 p.m. (April Hewlett Williams, Needlework Enthusiast, Fairfield County) Learn basic techniques for beginner's needle tatting. Learn the art of making "poor man's lace." Bring a #5 tatting needle, #10 crochet thread and scissors **OR Kit Available: \$10.00 Class Limit: 10**

Beginning Shuttle Tatting – OFFERED ONCE - 9:15 a.m. (Eunice Hayes, Sewing Professional, Licking County) Participants will learn a little history of tatting and lacemaking, while getting the basics of the double stitch and making rings. **Kit Cost: \$5.00** (which includes filled shuttle) **Class Limit: 12**

Beyond Quilted Coats – 1:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Teara Corman, Owner, Lazy J Quilting, Licking County) More ideas on how to incorporate quilting and blocks into clothing and wearable accessories. Don't know what to do with those leftover blocks? Want to repurpose that quilt into something new? I'll give you tips, tricks, and ideas for how to upcycle and use those blocks you've been keeping.

Brief History & Maintenance of Singer Featherweight Machines: Little Powerhouse in the Little Black Case – 10:15 a.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Renee Slattery, Sewing Enthusiast & Member of Columbus Metropolitan Quilters, Franklin County) Class will include a brief history of these "treasures" and ideas on where to find them. Once found/discovered, how to maintain them, including basic cleaning, and service points to keep them running as well as what to do if you have a big problem. These are great machines for basic sewing and quilting projects and can be easily carried.

Card Making – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Rebecca Thompson, Crafting Enthusiast, Licking County) Learn the basic fundamentals of making greeting cards while making a simple make-and-take card. **Cost: \$4.00 Class Limit: 15**

Circle 'Quilt' No-Quilt Quilt – 12:15 p.m. & 2:15 p.m. (Rosanna Pryor, Sewing Enthusiast, Noble County) Learn hints, tips and tricks for making a no-quilt quilt from assembled circles resembling the cathedral window design. Hoping to inspire a few fabric hoarders to bust into their stash and create some lovely no quilt-quilts!

Continuous Prairie Points – 10:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Patsy Cruyton, Quilting Educator, Coshocton County) Prairie Points add a finishing touch to quilts, wall hangings, placemats, purses, towels, and much more. Learning to make continuous Prairie Points is quick, easy and fun.

Creating a Flower Stitch Scarf – OFFERED ONCE - 12:15 p.m. (Joyce Lewis, Owner, The Yarn Shop, Columbus) Learn how to do the simple "Hanna Ami" flower stitch technique. You will be working on a skinny scarf and talking about other possibilities with the loom. Bring the following supplies: G crochet hook, #4 acrylic yarn in two solid colors. Must know how to do basic crochet stitches (slip stitch, single crochet and double crochet). **Cost: \$8.00** which includes loom, instructions, and pattern. **Class Limit: 10**

Defining Detail: Quilting Basics and Beyond – 9:15 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. (Tina Milenovic, Sewing Enthusiast, Fairfield County) This class will help quilting beginners understand basic terms and techniques, overview of various quilting tools, and learn about methods to expand their quilting adventure. Both hand and machine quilting will be included.

Design by Draping Basics – OFFERED ONCE - 11:15 a.m. (Cindy Shuster, OSU Extension Emeriti, Perry County) In this class you will learn how to make a dimensional garment pattern with the aid of a dress form by pinning and placing the fabric (draping) against the dress form. Basic pattern/sewing knowledge helpful.

Frosting and Sprinkles – OFFERED ONCE - 12: 15 p.m. (Eunice Hayes, Sewing Professional, Licking County) The children will stuff, "frost and decorate" a felt pastry. In the process they will learn how to sew a ladder stitch and how to sew on beads and sequins. Kit includes a pre-sewn felt "pastry," the trims, needles, and threads. Suitable age would be second grade and up. **Kit Cost: \$5.00 Class Limit: 15**

Fun with "Hexies" – 10:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Debra Pipes, Master Clothing Educator, Perry County) Quilting with hexagons, "hexies" for short, might not be new, but it is trending now. Come, learn how to make "hexies" and the variety of items you can make using this vintage quilting technique.

Bring a 6 or 8-inch embroidery hoop and small scissors. **Kits: \$5.00** (Includes fabric, floss and needle). **Class Limit:10**

How to Enrich Your Sewing – 9:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Karen Heath, Ambassador for Central Ohio, Dress A Girl Around the World) Enrich your sewing and yourself by sewing for those in need and/or less fortunate. Ideas on what to look for when choosing a charity, where your charitable sewing items are distributed, and various charity guidelines will be discussed.

In a Bind? Binding Your Quilt – 9:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Bonnie Perkins, Director, Sew Special Network, Danville) This class will show how to make binding two ways and why you might need more than one. Additionally, you will learn how to bind your quilt and finish it by hand or machine for both steps.

Jewelry Making: The Basics – 9:15 a.m. & 12:15 p.m. (Jill Bennett, Sewing Enthusiast, Franklin County) What do you need to start making your own jewelry: supplies (like findings, spacers, beads) and where to buy them. Learn how to make simple, elegant designs: with demonstrations of how to make beaded bracelets, earrings, necklaces, and special showing of handmade ceramic earthenware beads.

Know Your Sewing Machine – 10:15 a.m. & 1:15 p.m. (Chuck Lewis, Owner, Chuck's Sewing Machine Repair, Muskingum County) Get to know your sewing machine. Learn how to maintain and troubleshoot your machine.

Make & Take Paper and Fabric Ornament – 9:15 a.m. & 10:15 a.m. (Laura VanDeusen, Sewing Enthusiast, Dekalb County, GA) Kids welcome but please bring an adult to help with cutting thick paper and sewing on a button. **Kits: \$5.00 Class Limit: 20**

Come and learn the basic principles of paper piecing. It's easier than it sounds. After watching this demonstration, you will be able to do your own paper piecing!
