



Classes & Descriptions

Accuracy Matters – 11:00 a.m. & 2:30 p.m. (Kim Nixon, Owner, Sew Original Stitchess, Industry, PA) Want to add more accuracy and precision to your quilting projects? Learn how to “dissect” a quilt pattern into standard, slightly oversized subsets that can be trimmed to precision with specialized rulers using Studio 180 Rulers© and Deb Tucker’s methodology for precision quilting.

Basics of Card Making – 10:00 a.m. & 1:30 p.m. (Rebecca Thompson, Crafting Enthusiast, Franklin County) Come join me for the fun of learning how to make cards and tags. This will be a make and take with lots of ideas. **Class Fee: \$5.00**

Basket Weaving – OFFERED ONCE – 1:30 p.m. (Joyce Lewis, Owner, The Yarn Shop, Columbus) Learn the craft of weaving by making a 5”x7”x2” basket for your bathroom or kitchen. Please bring 1 skein of #4 solid color or variegated yarn, tapestry needle, scissors, and measuring tape. **Cost: \$8.00** which includes 2 basket frames and instructions. **Class Limit: 10**

Beginning Crochet – 9:00 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. (Sara Burton, Crocheting Enthusiast, Muskingum County) Learn crochet basics . . . supplies needed, how to make a slip knot, chain stitch, and single, and double crochet in this hands-on class. Bring a light-colored, (dark colors are difficult for beginners to see stitches) 4-ply yarn, size J/10 crochet hook and a pair of scissors. **Class Limit: 18**

Beginning Needle Tatting – (DOUBLE SESSIONS) – 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. & 1:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. (April Hewlett Williams, Needlework Enthusiast, Fairfield County) Learn tatting by using a needle. Bring a #5 tatting needle, #10 cotton thread and a pair of embroidery scissors. Extra class supplies will be available.

Brief History & Maintenance of Singer Featherweight Machines: Little Powerhouse in the Little Black Case – OFFERED ONCE – 9:00 a.m. (Renee Slattery, Sewing Enthusiast, Franklin County) Class will include a brief history of these “treasures” and ideas on where to find them. Once found/discovered, how to maintain them, including basic cleaning, and service points to keep them running as well as what to do if you have a big problem. These are great machines for basic sewing and quilting projects and easily carried.

Cathedral Window Block by Machine and Hand – 9:00 a.m. & 11:00 a.m. (Bonnie Perkins, Director, Sew Special Network, Danville) Cathedral Window is a good Summer weight quilt that does not need batting. You’ll learn techniques to accomplish by hand or machine.

Children’s Sewing Class: I LOVE Sewing – OFFERED ONCE – 9:00 a.m. (Eunice Hayes, Sewing Professional, Licking County) In this class, geared toward our younger sewing enthusiasts, students will make a handsewn felt pincushion. It is recommended for students who are at least second grade, but any child who can cut with a pair of scissors could manage this simple class. **Class Fee: \$5.00 Class Limit: 15**

Clothesline Rope Baskets and More – 11:00 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. (Linda Crane, Sewing Enthusiast, Medina County) Clothesline Rope Baskets are a fun way to use your scrap fabric collection. You will learn how to make potholders and purses after learning the basics.

Creative Bindings – OFFERED ONCE – 10:00 a.m. (Lisa Stough, Sewing Enthusiast, Licking County) Let’s talk bindings! This hands-on demonstration will help you solve those binding issues for your handmade items along with a trunk show of various creative ways to bind.

Disappearing Nine Patch – 12:30 p.m. & 1:30 p.m. (Patsy Cruyton, Quilting Educator, Coshocton County) Learn how to take a simple Nine Patch Block and turn it into a beautiful block to make an amazing quilt.

Demystifying the Half Square Triangle – 12:30 p.m. & 2:30 p.m. (Jill Bennett, Sewing Enthusiast, Franklin County) Participants will be shown various ways to make half-square triangles (HST), from single to multiple HSTs, various methods to square up the HSTs, various layout patterns, recommended tools, and also how to make HST without any specialized tools to get the quilter started.

Enhance Your Sewing Skills – 10:00 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. (Debra Pipes, Master Clothing Educator, Perry County) Learn hints and techniques for the novice to the advanced sewist to make your garment sewing experience more enjoyable and relaxing.

Envelope Pillowcase (Kid Friendly Class) – 10:00 a.m & 11:00 a.m. (Maggie Brotherton, Sewing Enthusiast, Fairfield County) Kits provided by instructor including pattern for a 12 x 12 pillow form and precut fabric for participants. Learn how to do a basic straight stitch by hand. Recommended for students to bring fabric shears, scissors. **Class Limited to Kits Available.**

Fabric Flowers – 1:30 p.m. & 2:30 p.m. (Etta Trimpi, Sewing Enthusiast, Cuyahoga County) Learn to make flowers from leftover fabric. It’s fun, easy and surprising.

Practice wrapping techniques in class and learn to make an alternative ribbon that you can take home.

The memory keepsake pillows will focus on how to create a fabric collage of pillows that highlight memories by incorporating lace, buttons, pictures, etc.

Long Arm Dos and Don’ts from a Long arm Quilter– 10:00 a.m. & 11:00 a.m. (Teara Corman, Owner, Lazy J Quilting, Licking County) Learn the basics of how you should prepare your quilt top and backing for quilting. Tips and tricks for best results will be shared including time for Q & A.

Make a Denim Pocket Angel – OFFERED ONCE – 1:30 p.m. (Debra Shaw, Quilting Professional, Coshocton County) In this class you will learn how to use an upcycled denim pocket to make an adorable angel! Some useful tips on working and sewing with upcycled denim will be covered as well.

Make and Take Pin Cushion – 11:00 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. (Kimm Mumaw, Sewing Enthusiast, Wayne County) Make a “vintage” 4-H Pin Cushion using a wide-mouth jar lid.
